5 CHAIRMAN WARFIELD: Good afternoon, ladies and Welcome to the Board of Police Commissioners 6 gentlemen. 7 special closed session meeting regarding some personnel matters. My name is Jerome Warfield, Chairman of the 8 9 Board of Police Commissioners. Serving with us today is 10 the Vice Chairman for the Board of Police Commissioners, Commissioner Adela Rivera, Commissioner Mr. Donnell 11 12 White. Also we have with us the Chief of Police. 13 Chief, good to have you, sir, Ralph Godbee. And I'm 14 going to ask if our Board Secretary, Mr. George Anthony, 15 will move us on from here.

SECRETARY ANTHONY: Through the Chair, George 16 17 Anthony for the record. There has been a request for a 18 closed door session pursuant to the Open Meetings Act 19 under Michigan law. As a public body, your meetings are 20 subject to the Open Meetings Act or the OMA. The OMA 21 defines a meeting as the convening of a public body at 22 which a quorum is present for the purpose of 23 deliberating towards or rendering a decision on a public policy. That's MCL 15.262(b). 24

The OMA, however, does allow a public body to



call a closed session, one limited to the public body 1 2 and its invitees for specific purposes. Only 3 deliberations may be conducted in closed session. All 4 decisions must be made at a meeting open to the public. 5 While in the closed session, the Board makes no decisions. That must be done on the record. 6 7 On Thursday, May 5th, 2011, you will be presented with a suspension without pay recommendation. 8 9 I think that should be Thursday, May 10th, which is 10 today's date -- Tuesday, excuse me, May 10th, you will 11 be presented with a suspension without pay 12 recommendation for Police Officers George Loynes, and 13 I'll spell that, L-o-y-n-e-s, Badge 982; Leonard Ball, Badge 973; Jamil, J-a-m-i-l, Martin, Badge 5008; and 14 15 Henry Jackson, Badge 3829. Through their representative, DPOA Attorney 16 17 John L. Goldpaugh, these officers have requested a 18 closed session for the purpose of contesting the The closed 19 suspension without pay recommendation. 20 session will be called pursuant to MCL 15.268(a) of the 21 Open Meetings Act, which states in part, Section 8(a), 22 "Personnel matters. A public body may meet in a closed 23 session to consider the suspension of or hear charges brought against an employee. A simple majority vote or 24 25 quorum of three is required to close a session for this
