17	COMMISSIONER WHITE: Thank you, sir.
18	Under standing committee reports I do see Deputy
19	Chief Tolliver with us. Deputy Chief, if you
20	would come forward, please.
21	Commissioners, before you in your
22	package of information is information pertaining
23	to the 2012-2013 departmental budget which is
24	presented for our approval.
25	If you have any questions at this time,



1	I'm sure Deputy Chief would be happy to assist us
2	in answering any of those questions that we might
3	have as we move towards approval of the budget.
4	DEPUTY CHIEF TOLLIVER: Good afternoon
5	to this body. 2nd Deputy Chief Tina Tolliver.
6	I'm open for any questions on the 2012-2013
7	budget request.
8	COMMISSIONER WHITE: Deputy chief, if
9	you could, would you mind just a general overview
10	of where we are. I know we've done it in a
11	previous meeting, but just a general overview of
12	where we are, please.
13	DEPUTY CHIEF TOLLIVER: The police
14	department started its budget preparation for
15	2012-2013 late last calendar year. As part of
16	the Charter we presented the budget to the Board
17	of Police Commissioners for their review and
18	approval.
19	The budget as requested the total
20	I'm sorry, I don't have the budget as
21	requested included \$383 million and that would be
22	for all funds, and was offset by total revenues
23	totaling \$69.7 million for a total net cost of
24	\$313.7 million.



Within that budget request that we

25

1	submitted we were required to adhere to the
2	instructions as presented by the Budget
3	Department, City's Budget Department, which
4	included a cut amount that we were to adhere to.
5	And so the request as submitted to this
6	body includes that cut and at the time it
7	included a reduction of 204 positions.
8	That's the general overview.
9	COMMISSIONER WHITE: Thank you, Deputy
10	Chief. Any questions? Commissioner Warfield?
11	COMMISSIONER WARFIELD: I have not been
12	able to see the line items in the, book, so I'll
13	wait
14	COMMISSIONER WHITE: Commission Taylor?
15	COMMISSIONER TAYLOR: No, I don't have
16	any.
17	COMMISSIONER WHITE: Thank you, Deputy
18	Chief. So Commissioners Mr. Secretary, if you
19	have extra copies, but it is a copy of the Board
20	of Police Commissioners resolution approving the
21	Detroit Police Department budget fiscal year
22	2011-2012. If we could share those copies so we
23	know what if we vote this up at our next
24	meeting, or down or have any questions that the
25	Commissioners may have in the interim



1	And I do have some information for you,
2	Commissioners, if you would like to take this
3	with you today.
4	Under new business we have a
5	presentation from Ms. Dianne Perukel of our
6	alcohol program coordinator from the Michigan
7	Office of Highway Safety Planning.
8	Welcome.
9	MS. PERUKEL: Thank you. Good
10	afternoon. I'm Dianne Perukel, I'm with the
11	Office of Highway Safety Planning and we are a
12	civilian division of state police and we have
13	four grants with Detroit Police Department.
14	And you guys are probably familiar with
15	people coming forward asking permission to ask
16	for the grants. We are the ones that don't
17	require any match, so.
18	Two weeks ago three officers presented
19	at the Michigan Traffic Safety Summit on the good
20	work that they're doing with the Youth Alcohol
21	Enforcement Grant and afterwards Officer Viera
22	Brownlee and I discussed me coming here before
23	the Board and just giving kind of an overview of
24	the four grants that we give DPD and the good
25	work that they do.



1	I think very much worth mentioning is
2	the Grants and Contracts Section does an
3	excellent job with the grant oversight. I've
4	been I've had a grant with Detroit Police
5	Department for 10 years and we audit them every
6	year and there's never been any issue, they've
7	always been very attentive and efficient and it's
8	just it's really good to be able to go to
9	other police agencies and say you know they're
10	like, "Oh, we have such a large agency, you're
11	bound to find stuff."
12	I'm like, "Really? We don't find
13	anything with Detroit," so. The funding for the
14	Traffic Enforcement Grant pays for overtime for
15	enforcement of impaired driving laws and it's a
16	city-wide grant and as a result of the efforts,
17	just the visibility of traffic enforcement to the
18	people in the City of Detroit and people that
19	come to visit Detroit is just priceless.
20	We did some analysis and since 2006 the
21	number of crashes in Detroit has declined by more
22	than 21 percent and that's a direct result of the
23	work that your officers are doing. We also have
24	a Traffic Crash Prevention Education and Outreach
25	Grant with Community Services and Lt. Terry

1	Herbert has just done an excellent job with
2	incorporating any traffic safety messages into
3	the community policing that he does.

Detroiters have a lower use rate for car seats and he's just done a great job of any time they're speaking in front of parents to offer them assistance and we also give away free car seat -- grant money for free car seats for Detroiters and it has just been a really -- a really great endeavor.

The eCrash system is the Electronic Crash and Capture Submission Grant and that was under the leadership of Officers Viera Brownlee and Marcus Cummings and last November DPD began submitting 100 percent of their traffic crash reports electronically to the State, and you might think wow, how important is that.

Well, our office doesn't offer competitive grants, we offer grants based on the data that we look at, and if you're submitting the reports electronically, it comes to the State quicker, there's less chances for error because you're entering a UD-10 crash report online and if there's an error, it just bounces back as opposed to mailing in the report, somebody in



1	Lansing reviewing it and sending it back.
2	So the error rate has improved from
3	3.64 per crash report to .07 and that's probably
4	one of the best numbers in the state. The
5	average number of days the crash reports were
6	coming, it used to be 42 days when it was
7	submitted paper copy and now it's down to nine
8	days and, again, that's really excellent.
9	And, again, if we have good data coming
10	from the City of Detroit we're able to make
11	better decisions on the funding needs that you're
12	going to need for traffic crashes.
13	Finally, I want to talk about the Youth
14	Alcohol Enforcement Grant which has kind of been
15	under my purview, and just over the last probably
16	four or five years officers have conducted about
17	800 compliance checks on liquor licensees across
18	the city, and compliance checks, they're a proven
19	strategy to reduce youth access to alcohol.
20	There's a higher liquor license density
21	right in the city of Detroit, so youth may have
22	easier access to alcohol, but as long as they're
23	doing the compliance checks, the licensees kind
24	of know we've got to keep it in check, we've got
25	to ID some people.



Τ	Officers from the Central, Northeast
2	and 8th Precincts have successfully shut down
3	about 25 large scale blind pig parties since
4	November of 2010. And they do this is a very
5	soft manner. It's not guns ablazing going in,
6	it's using the controlled dispersal method which
7	has officers come in to a party and they contain
8	the scene. It's very calm, it's very orderly.
9	They get everybody that's over 21 out the door,
10	everybody under 21 they either give them a
11	citation. If they need medical attention, they
12	get it and I personally have ridden along with
13	them and they just do a very outstanding job.
14	Because of all of the stuff that
15	they've been doing with the Youth Alcohol
16	Enforcement Grant they've been asked to present
17	at two national conferences, one state-wide
18	conference like I said that they did two weeks
19	ago, a national webinar and they're probably
20	going to be speaking at two other state-wide
21	conferences before the year is over.
22	And I will say it's interesting to note
23	the times I've ridden along they're not afraid,
24	they're very brave, but then when I ask them to
25	do public speaking, they're kind of nervous, so



1	just	an	inside	note	on	that.

2	But our office has also provided a lot
3	of training to Detroit officers that they've
4	attended, they've given good feedback and in
5	order to work an impaired driving enforcement
6	detail you have to be standardized field sobriety
7	test trained and there's police officers act
8	as instructors for that and about five years ago
9	there was only maybe one police officer that
10	DPD officer that was SFST certified to do the
11	training and now there's up to five or six, so
12	you guys have all you guys can train
13	yourselves now too and that's a very good thing.
14	Our office also put together a drug

Our office also put together a drug recognition expert training. We were the 49th state to adopt a drug recognition expert program and I have to say I'm smart enough to write the grant to get the program. There's no way I could pass it. It's like two weeks of college chemistry and then a week of evaluations with people that are on drugs, and through the first school came Officer Scott Hall from Central District. They kind of joked that he's kind of like a trooper in a DPD uniform. He's really adamant about the Detroit program, so that was



1	another big coup for your department.
2	We've also put together some digital
3	investigative training where officers learn how
4	to use social media websites as an investigative
5	tool and 40 officers are currently trained with
6	40 more signed up in the next month to take it.
7	The focus of the training is kind of
8	underage drinking specific, but I know the
9	officers have e-mailed me afterward and say we
10	found a homicide suspect, we're finding people
11	with outstanding warrants just from the skills
12	and the tools that they've taken from the class.
13	So any questions for me?
14	COMMISSIONER WHITE: Thank you,
15	Ms. Perukel? Questions, Commissioner Warfield?
16	COMMISSIONER WARFIELD: None.
17	COMMISSIONER WHITE: Commissioner
18	Taylor?
19	COMMISSIONER TAYLOR: Yes, I just have
20	one. You had mentioned the free car seat
21	giveaway. Can you give us some more
22	MS. PERUKEL: Officer Viera Brownlee
23	coordinates that and I know they use some car
24	seat checks and the rule from the State is if
25	they give a car seat away it has to be in an



1	event where there is a certified technician to
2	show the parents how to properly install it so.
3	April 21st is the next one.
4	COMMISSIONER WHITE: Thank you. At
5	this time is there any old business? Seeing none

MS. HAWKINS: Good afternoon. My name

25

1	is Charonda Hawkins. On August 29, 2011 my
2	husband Brandon Johnson was murdered in the
3	Martin Luther King Apartments at approximately
4	3:20 AM.
5	As of this date my husband's case has
6	been underinvestigated. His case was turned over
7	to Sgt. Bowser. I've run into brick wall after
8	brick wall trying to locate this man.
9	I've been given very little information
10	regarding anything done regarding trying to solve
11	his case. My husband was with two neighbors. At
12	the time it was reported that it was an attempted
13	carjacking. The news was out that morning. My
14	husband was referred to as the Good Samaritan who
15	was murdered trying to defend a neighbor from an
16	attempted carjack.
17	We had since learned that there was
18	more to the case that what was originally thought
19	to be. His case was mishandled from the
20	beginning. We were told that someone shot into
21	the car. The cars were never taken in. The two
22	people that were with my husband that morning
23	were never brought in.
24	It was suspected that the gentleman in
25	the car knew more of what went on that morning.



1	He's never been brought in.
2	My life and my daughter's life has been
3	completely turned upside down. These guys are
4	still out here. They've come actually one of
5	the gentlemen that I believe is involved in my
6	husband's murder has actually come to my home
7	wanting to confront me about why I'm not letting
8	this case go and why do I feel that he had
9	something to do with it.
_ 0	I've tried to give this information to
.1	Sgt. Bowser. It goes nowhere. I'm actually
_2	policing my husband's case myself. I get leads,
.3	I run them down. I try to give this information,
4	I get no response and right now I feel like I
_5	have to police myself and my family because I
_6	can't depend on the police to help me.
. 7	I don't know what to do. Can someone
- 8	help me get some resolve to this case?
9	COMMISSIONER WHITE: Let me first offer
20	our condolences for the loss of your husband and,
21	two, applaud you for your courage in coming down
22	here today, but continue to look into the matter
23	on your own, but certainly Deputy Chief, is there
2.4	someone that we can match Ms. Hawkins with today

that can ensure that she gets some follow-through

1	and updates as relates to her case?
2	DEPUTY CHIEF LEE: Yes, I offer my
3	condolences as well. See me directly after this
4	meeting. I will put you in touch with the Deputy
5	Chief over that particular district.
6	MS. HAWKINS: Thank you very much.
7	COMMISSIONER WHITE: Thank you,
8	Ms. Hawkins, and Deputy Chief, we would ask if we
9	could the Commissioners would be provided with
10	an update next week as to the status of
11	Ms. Hawkins' case and the loss of her husband.
12	At this time again please be reminded
13	the next Board of Police Commissioners meeting
14	will be held Thursday, April 12, 2012 at 6:30 PM
15	at the Northwestern District within the
16	Northeastern District at the Butzel Center, 7737
17	Kercheval, Detroit, Michigan 48214.
18	If there's no further business before
19	this body at this time, a motion for adjournment
20	is in order.
