5 COMMISSIONER WARFIELD: Good afternoon, ladies
6 and gentlemen, and welcome to the Board of Police
7 Commissioners meeting. My name is Jerome Warfield,
8 member of the Board of Police Commissioners. Serving
9 with me this afternoon is Commissioner Jessica Taylor.
10 And of course we have chief of police, Chief Ralph
11 Godbee with us. From our staff, we have our board
12 secretary Mr. George Anthony. And I'm going to ask if
13 he will introduce our staff at this time.

14 SECRETARY ANTHONY: Thank you, Mr. Chair.
15 George Anthony for the record. We have present
16 Miss Dalph Watson who is our director of police
17 personnel, Lieutenant Tim Leech who is our acting chief
18 investigator. We have Mr. Robert Brown who is standing
19 in the back is our office manager, Sergeant Alan Quinn
20 who is recording our proceeding and Ms. Wendy Boer from
21 Hanson Court Reporting Service. That completes the
22 introductions, sir.

23 COMMISSIONER WARFIELD: Thank you. Is there a
24 chaplain here to do our invocation? Let us pray.
25 Father God, we thank you for this day. We thank you

1 just for being our God and our guide. We ask that as we
2 gather together to discuss matters of safety regarding
3 the City, that you would please us in our discussion,
4 that you would give us your wisdom. We ask, Lord, that
5 your hand of grace and mercy will stretch out over this
6 City, that in this wave of violence and crime, that you
7 would bring it to an end and to a close. We ask that
8 you will protect your people in this city and that you
9 will cover them with your blood. In Christ's name we
10 pray, amen.

11 AUDIENCE: Amen.

12 COMMISSIONER WARFIELD: We are meeting without
13 a quorum. So we will not be able to take any official
14 actions right now. We're waiting for our Chair to
15 arrive. We know that he is unfortunately taking care of
16 some more things that are very very pressing. So we
17 will move through the agenda with those items that we do
18 not have to vote on right now in the hopes that we will
19 garnish a quorum later. Chief, is there a report from
20 your office, sir?

21 CHIEF GODBEE: Through the Chair, no. We do
22 not have a report today. We had a presentation
23 scheduled from internal affairs. But due to an
24 unplanned family emergency for Commander Stairs, he is
25 not able to be here to present. So we would ask for

1 that to be rescheduled.

2 COMMISSIONER WARFIELD: Okay. Thank you, sir.
3 Also, we did have a personnel issue today. And we
4 understand that the attorneys want to make a public
5 record. You may come and do so at this time.

6 MR. GOLDPAUGH: Good afternoon, Commissioners.
7 Attorney John Goldpaugh appearing on behalf of the
8 grieving officer.

9 MS. JONES: Leticia Jones on behalf of the
10 City of Detroit Police Department. Forgive me. I have
11 laryngitis. Greg normally handles these cases. He has
12 taken another job. So I am in his stead.

13 MR. GOLDPAUGH: Commissioner, as the
14 Commissioners pointed out, there is no quorum at this
15 point in time. We did request a closed door hearing
16 under the Open Meetings Act. Because of that, I have
17 had some discussions with Miss Jones. We are asking
18 that the petition be put over for two weeks if that's
19 acceptable to the Board.

20 COMMISSIONER WARFIELD: Sure. Is that good
21 with you?

22 MS. JONES: That's good with me because I
23 understand that you're in the community next week.

24 MR. GOLDPAUGH: Though I am planning on being
25 out of town, I'll be back in time or I will make sure

1 someone is here to handle that. Thank you very much,
2 Commissioners.

3 COMMISSIONER WARFIELD: Thank you. We do have
4 -- under new business, we do have a resolution for
5 retired Lieutenant Christopher -- oh, Lord, somebody
6 help me -- Vintevoghel. Thank you. And, certainly we
7 cannot vote to receive it into the archives, but we can
8 read it into the record. Do we want to read it into the
9 record this week or --

10 SECRETARY ANTHONY: We can do it next week.

11 COMMISSIONER WARFIELD: Sure. If it's okay,
12 we will read that into the record next week so we can
13 officially vote on it and take that matter under -- we
14 will take it up then at that time. Moving right along
15 to announcements, our next meeting of the Board of
16 Police Commissioners will be held on Thursday, May 10,
17 at 6:30 p.m. We will be in the community at the Old
18 Redford Academy Middle School which is located at 22122
19 McNichols Road in Detroit, Michigan, 48219. That's of
20 course in the great Northwest District, precinct, or
21 Precinct 8.

22 I also want to apprise you that the Michigan
23 Chronicle is sponsoring Stops & Cops, Use Survival Guide
24 for Police Encounters. That would happen on -- that's
25 going to happen on Saturday, May the 5th, 2012, 1:00

1 p.m. I'm sorry, 10:00 a.m. to 12:00 p.m. Again,
2 10:00 a.m. to 12:00 p.m. That's going to be at Cobo
3 Convention Center here in downtown Detroit. I think
4 it's sponsored by the NAACP as well. But I don't see
5 their name on it. But okay. Please keep that under
6 advisement.

7 At this time, we are going to move to public
8 comment. If you wish to address the Board, you may come
9 to the podium in the center of the room, give us your
10 name and spell it for the record. And you may address
11 the Board for two minutes. And we please ask,
12 especially today, that you stay with the two-minute time
13 limit please if there are any comments. It's hot in
14 here. I am not in a hurry, no. I just want something
15 cool.

16 MS. SMITH: Bernice Smith, political office.
17 Glad to see you, Chief. Long time no see. And to the
18 Commissioners, to my dear Secretary. Chief, you weren't
19 here previously when I was giving out some bad advice
20 for the police department. And I'm sure that you know
21 and you have been investigating a couple of weeks ago
22 when the young man or the felon came into the police
23 station and he was not admitted because they said that
24 it was closed. And then he came the next day. Rara,
25 that's his name. And he came the next day. And he was

1 not received then. And he had to get his friend who is
2 a policeman to bring him in. So, I hope that's being
3 taken care of since you're here so I can tell you in
4 person.

5 CHIEF GODBEE: Yes, ma'am.

6 MS. SMITH: Now we got another problem. Most
7 of you don't know, but I do commentary on the radio with
8 Angelo. Today we had a very very heartbreaking
9 conversation with a police officer that you all must
10 know or do know, Matthews. Arthur Matthews is his name.
11 What happened to him yesterday at court in Judge
12 Boykin's courtroom was really upsetting to him. And
13 then when he brought it to the audience this morning, we
14 all was upset. And we got telephone numbers to call the
15 judge and so forth. I did myself. But in the meantime,
16 some of the things that he told us was the problems that
17 he was having with the police department.

18 Now, I'm not going to go into details because
19 I know you are investigating it and you're going to take
20 care of it for the young man because of the fact that he
21 is on disability now and certain things and rules in the
22 police department that's not afforded to him. So, I
23 hope this is not an injustice but something that the
24 police department will take care of. And also, when I
25 called the judge's office, I talked with his executive

1 secretary. And she stated to me that it wasn't solely
2 the judge's fault that this decision was rendered. It
3 got together with the prosecutor. His name is Talinski
4 (phonetic). But anyway, so, we will have to deal with
5 Kim Worthy's office in regards to that situation for
6 them to come together and make that decision. 14 to 25
7 is horrible for any judge or any prosecutor to agree
8 upon when you have a fellow that has over 14 charges
9 against him. And then in the mean time, the judge get
10 all these letters of -- from the family and friends and
11 so forth. Come on. How many prisoners get letters sent
12 but they still go to jail?

13 But in the meantime, this was an injustice for
14 this officer. And most of you know I solely support my
15 police department. But when you're wrong, I will come
16 before you and explain to you what I think and what my
17 thoughts are. In the meantime, I'm asking the Board, I
18 asked the young man would he come and talk with the
19 police commissioners today. So, I don't see him here.
20 But in the meantime, I would like very much for the
21 commissioners, myself personally, to write or have our
22 secretary write to Kim Worthy in regards to that
23 decision and let her know that it was not a fair
24 decision for especially an officer who has put his life
25 on the line like most of you have. And you know how you

1 feel about being in danger, especially when you're being
2 shot at. And that's what happened to him because I do
3 remember the incident.

4 But the fact is, we want to stick together and
5 let the public know that we are not going to have
6 fellows shooting at police officers and then getting
7 away with it by having a minimum or a guideline of
8 suspension of their time. Now, that was told to me was
9 a guideline between the prosecutor and the judge. I
10 don't think it was fair. And I do wish that the
11 Commissioners would intervene and send a letter in
12 regards to this situation and let them know that you
13 were not satisfied with that particular decision. I
14 thank you very much for your attention.

15 COMMISSIONER WARFIELD: Thank you, Mrs. Smith.

16 MR. MOORE: Good afternoon to the Board, to
17 our Chief, Detroit's finest and to the family. My name
18 is Edward Moore. I am the liaison of the Honorable
19 Kwame Kenyatta, our Detroit city councilman, bringing
20 warm greetings from his office. To the Board, as I have
21 stated many times before, wherever the councilman can
22 fit in, let him be a team player and fit in. He is in
23 office at this time. Let him work with you as whatever
24 player you want him on the team.

25 To the Chief, I want to thank you for coming

1 to 4217. You know that's my home. So, we are so happy
2 for you to come out in Southwest Detroit. What the
3 grievance of the family in Southwest Detroit was
4 stating, you say that you would work on it. And it
5 would be taken care of. And I'm sure that your word
6 means something to all of us. So, I want to thank the
7 Board, the Chief and Detroit's finest for doing a good
8 job thus far. Thank you.

9 COMMISSIONER WARFIELD: Thank you, Mr. Moore.
10 Is that it?

11 CHIEF GODBEE: If I could just make a very
12 brief announcement, we would like to apprise the public
13 also for on Friday, May 4th at 8:00 a.m., we will be
14 holding our 13th annual Detroit Police Interfaith
15 Candlelight Vigil service which will be followed by our
16 annual Detroit Police Interfaith Memorial Service. It
17 takes place at Old St. Mary's Church which is right
18 around the corner at 646 Monroe Street. And it is a
19 very very important event for our department. We would
20 certainly love as many community members to attend as
21 possible.

22 COMMISSIONER WARFIELD: Absolutely. For those
23 of you who have not had an opportunity to attend, it is
24 a very moving service and a very thought provoking
25 service in serving. Those of you who can, please do

1 come. You might want to remind your neighbors to come
2 as well. Thank you, Chief. Yes, ma'am?

3 MS. HAWKINS: Hi. My name is Sharonda
4 Hawkins. I'm here on behalf of my husband, Brandon
5 Johnson who was murdered August 29th, 2011. I have been
6 attending these meetings for the past few Thursdays. I
7 have been given a lot of information and told that this
8 particular police sergeant who has my husband's case,
9 Sergeant Bowser, would be in contact with me. So far
10 that has not happened.

11 Yesterday, I did an interview with someone
12 from the Detroit News in regards to his unsolved murder
13 and the violence in the neighborhood in which we live.
14 At two previous meetings, I was told that you guys were
15 going to start cracking down on that area. So far the
16 police presence is very minimal. The crime is
17 continuing. And it's getting warm. So it's only going
18 to get worse. Can somebody please tell me when you guys
19 are going to do something?

20 CHIEF GODBEE: First of all, ma'am, I want to
21 give our sincere condolences for your loss. I'm always
22 moved by everybody who loses their life at the hands in
23 the City of Detroit. Secondly, we are doing a
24 tremendous amount of work. Our officers, although
25 they're very overtaxed -- I have about 1200 fewer

1 officers than some of my predecessors, have 300 fewer
2 than my immediate predecessor. And we will probably be
3 losing even more before this budget situation is over.
4 But within that, I am not hopeless at all. But I am
5 very confident at the steps that we have taken to put
6 more police officers out in the street. What area,
7 general area?

8 MS. HAWKINS: I live in the Martin Luther King
9 apartments.

10 CHIEF GODBEE: That's the Northeast District.
11 Deputy Chief Lee, if you would just sit -- if you look
12 right behind you, Deputy Chief Benjamin Lee, he
13 coordinates the patrol operations for the east side.
14 And I want you to be assured also, lot of times you
15 don't see some of our undercover operations also through
16 our task force operations dealing with specific
17 narcotics issues, gun moving issues, because those task
18 forces are plain clothes undercover. So, those we are
19 not able to talk about publicly. But those are
20 additional assets that we have on the ground
21 investigating crimes in those areas.

22 But as to patrol saturation, if you have a
23 conversation with Deputy Chief Lee, he will be very glad
24 to work with you on some increased presence. I also
25 want you to talk to Deputy Chief Melvin Turner. We have

1 some community service resources that we may be able to
2 do some proactive like our mounted, may be able to have
3 them ride through and do some proactive things there.

4 MS. HAWKINS: One other question. Is there
5 any way to have my husband's case given to someone who
6 actually does want to look into it?

7 CHIEF GODBEE: I don't know the specific
8 sergeant you're referring to. But our investigators can
9 only investigate a case up and to the information that
10 they are given. When they have exhausted all leads,
11 then that's when ostensibly a case starts towards what
12 we call a cold case. But that is not a police issue.
13 That is a community issue. That's a witness issue. And
14 there are other investigative resources that if we don't
15 have someone that comes forward that knows something, we
16 are in the same position that you're in. But what we
17 will do is Assistant Chief Logan, someone from his staff
18 will get your information. They will give me an update
19 as to the progress on the case. And you will get a call
20 from the head of homicide, Inspector Dwayne Blackman.
21 So if you see one of those two gentlemen in the back,
22 those two sergeants. And ma'am, I really -- you know I
23 try not to be disingenuous with the public. The public
24 has to step up in this effort with us. Our
25 investigators can only investigate to the point with the

1 information that they are given. And they do tremendous
2 work. They really do. We unearth amazing things. But
3 without community cooperation, the best police efforts
4 will not close a case.

5 MS. HAWKINS: Thank you.

6 COMMISSIONER WARFIELD: Thank you, Miss
7 Hawkins. Are there others? Seeing none, we will
8 adjourn the meeting today for the Board of Police
9 Commissioners. Thank you all so very much for coming.
10 Hope you have a wonderful and blessed weekend. Thank
11 you.
