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- 2 CHAIRPERSON TAYLOR: Good afternoon and
- 3 welcome to the Board of Police Commissioners meeting.
- 4 I'm Commission Jessica Taylor. Commissioner White and
- 5 Warfield will not be here today so we're going to move
- 6 right through the agenda. I'd also like to introduce
- 7 from the Chief's office Commander Charles Wilson.
- 8 COMMANDER WILSON: Thank you.
- 9 CHAIRPERSON TAYLOR: George, can you
- 10 introduce our staff, please.
- 11 SECRETARY ANTHONY: Thank you. For the
- 12 record, George Anthony, secretary to the board. We
- 13 have present our office manager, Mr. Robert Brown,
- 14 seated at the table to my right. Sergeant Alan Quinn
- who's recording our proceedings, and Ms. Trisha Houpt
- 16 from Hanson Court Reporting Service. That completes
- 17 the introduction, ma'am.
- 18 CHAIRPERSON TAYLOR: Oh, and before I forget,
- 19 I would like to acknowledge that Commander Charles
- 20 Wilson just made commander. He got a promotion.
- 21 COMMANDER WILSON: Yes, I appreciate that,
- 22 ma'am. Thank you so much.
- CHAIRPERSON TAYLOR: All right. Now, we go
- 24 to -- do you have a report from the chief's office?
- 25 COMMANDER WILSON: Yes, madam president.



- 1 I'll keep it very brief. Two things, though, that I
- 2 want to highlight. One, Chief Craig has always been
- 3 transparent with our crime statistics. And one of
- 4 things I want to highlight for our community is that
- 5 we're still trending down on our homicides and
- 6 non-fatal shootings year to date. Currently we're down
- 7 40 homicides for about a 14 percent reduction and
- 8 currently down 18 fatal shootings for a 2 percent
- 9 reduction. So we continue to try to alleviate that
- 10 crime problem within the community through our CompStat
- 11 program. We're keeping our officers accountable and
- 12 making sure we're doing everything we can to drive down
- 13 crime.
- And lastly, the chief will be hosting his
- 15 first call to action in the community. It's going to
- 16 be held this Saturday from 10:00 a.m. until 2:00 p.m.
- 17 at try Triumph Church located at 2760 East Grand
- 18 Boulevard. We ask that everyone come out and meet with
- 19 the chief. And we can talk about how we can make our
- 20 city safer through CB patrols, neighborhood watches,
- 21 and things like that. So again, that's going to be
- 22 this Saturday.
- 23 SECRETARY ANTHONY: Can you repeat the
- 24 address.
- 25 COMMANDER WILSON: Yes. Triumph Church, 2760



- 1 East Grand Boulevard. I have fliers at the table if
- 2 any of the citizens want to get more information. That
- 3 will complete my report.
- 4 CHAIRPERSON TAYLOR: Okay. Thank you. We
- 5 can move to announcements. Our next meeting will be in
- 6 the Northeastern District next Thursday, October 10th,
- 7 Second Ebenezer Church. And that's at 14601 Dequindre.
- 8 Again, Ebenezer Church, 14601 Dequindre.
- 9 I'll now ask for oral communications from the
- 10 audience. Are there any communications?
- 11 MS. SMITH: Good afternoon. Bernice Smith,
- 12 political activist. I'll be very brief.
- 13 Congratulations to you, my dear.
- 14 COMMANDER WILSON: Thank you. I appreciate
- 15 it.
- MS. SMITH: I know your daddy is really proud
- 17 of you.
- 18 COMMANDER WILSON: Yes, ma'am.
- MS. SMITH: To the board, because I'm
- 20 supposed to say to the board when I want to address
- 21 something, there was no notice of hijacking. In other
- 22 words, a report on the hijacking.
- 23 COMMANDER WILSON: You mean carjacking?
- 24 CHAIRPERSON TAYLOR: Oh, carjackings. What
- 25 did I say, hijacking? Carjacking.



- 1 COMMANDER WILSON: I apologize. I don't have
- 2 those numbers with me, Ms. Bernice, but we'll get those
- 3 out for the next meeting.
- 4 MS. SMITH: I was a little disappointed when
- 5 I heard the news the night before last in regards to
- 6 the incident. But I understand. I'm not going to
- 7 bring to bear too bad in regards to the police. But I
- 8 do believe that the next time they make a raid, that
- 9 they make sure that they're not near a school. And I'm
- 10 under the assumption that the raids are normally at
- 11 night or early in the morning and not during -- well,
- 12 actually, they never had it done before by a school.
- 13 But I just thought per chance that next time we'll be
- 14 more careful and not have the raids near a school in
- 15 the area and, therefore, we won't have to worry about
- 16 any children being frightened because of the gun. I
- 17 know you're doing your job. I don't have any problem
- 18 with that. But let's be -- in regards to not having it
- 19 near a school next time we do a raid.
- 20 COMMANDER WILSON: If I may, through the
- 21 chair, we have a policy to address all of our raids.
- 22 We have a pre-raid protocol where we look at factors,
- 23 just what you're talking about. I have a six-year-old
- 24 daughter so I understand the concern in the community
- 25 when they talk about outside of schools. But moving



- 1 forward that won't be an issue. There are things that
- 2 we can do to mitigate that to make sure that we look at
- 3 time of day, make sure that the kids aren't anywhere
- 4 near the proximity of the raid. They did do
- 5 appropriate notifications to the school. But there are
- 6 definitely some things that we could do better, and
- 7 Chief Craig reiterated that to us the day of the event.
- 8 So we won't have anymore problems like that moving
- 9 forward.
- 10 MS. SMITH: And your chief was on the air, on
- 11 our radio program this morning. And there were some of
- 12 the Detroiters that made mention of that, too. So I
- 13 thought I would bring it before the board, also,
- 14 knowing that I know it was something that was not
- 15 planned directly, you know.
- 16 COMMANDER WILSON: Yes, ma'am.
- MS. SMITH: So I feel that it was an error on
- 18 your part as far as that particular time and the area
- 19 that they were in.
- 20 COMMANDER WILSON: Definitely could have been
- 21 better judgement.
- MS. SMITH: Also, the chief got good grades
- 23 with the audience on the radio this morning. I don't
- 24 believe I heard anyone that was negative about him,
- 25 only myself because I couldn't get on. I waited over



- 1 35 minutes, and I got mad. I hung up. But -- and
- 2 that's something very unusual. I think Angelo didn't
- 3 want me to talk maybe thinking I was going to say
- 4 something and embarrass him. But I was going to tell
- 5 him that he was doing a good job and that he is making
- 6 my words come true by earning his salary that I
- 7 discussed with him about and that he might be working
- 8 on a bonus. But I didn't get to say that. So when I
- 9 tell him or see him -- maybe Saturday I'll get to see
- 10 him if I don't have a funeral. But I think he is doing
- 11 a good job, and he is very determined to straighten out
- 12 the streets and to make sure that the criminals know
- 13 that the police is in charge and not them, like they've
- 14 been thinking all along, and doing all this shooting
- 15 going on. So I think he is doing a wonderful job, and
- 16 the people are very appreciative. We had several
- 17 police call in, also. One wanted to know about how he
- 18 can workup from the ranks because he's been in the
- 19 area, you know, patrolling for so long and he want to
- 20 know would the chief help him or make a suggestion in
- 21 how the police can move up in the ranks.
- 22 CHAIRPERSON TAYLOR: Do you want to say
- 23 something?
- 24 COMMANDER WILSON: Yes, myself and Chairperson
- 25 Taylor just met with the chief on some human resources



- 1 type issues. And one of the things we talked about was
- 2 promotions, coming up with a different process that
- 3 maybe can be more fair and equitable to all of the
- 4 officers. So he's looking at that. And then we also
- 5 talked about monitoring programs, ways we can look at
- 6 bringing up some of our younger officers who aspire to
- 7 a command position. So that's definitely going to be
- 8 in the future.
- 9 MS. SMITH: And the last, the morale. I
- 10 think it has really increased now more than ever in
- 11 this short time because of the fact that not only the
- 12 citizens realize that he is doing a good job and he's
- 13 trying to do a good job, but he's making sure that the
- 14 police men are doing their job. And I think he's doing
- 15 wonderful in that respect. And I'm glad that the
- 16 police are thinking a little bit better of their jobs
- 17 now.
- And then one thing that I did mention, about
- 19 their hours. I'm so glad that he is going to reduce
- 20 the hours because that's what I was concerned about
- 21 this past winter.
- 22 So next I'm going to pray on your medical
- insurance. And hopefully that will be the next thing
- that you'll be able to get taken care of, and you'll be
- 25 able to have it again. I thank you for your time.



- 1 CHAIRPERSON TAYLOR: Thank you, Ms. B.
- MS. PANNELL: Good afternoon. Sharon
- 3 Pannell.
- 4 CHAIRPERSON TAYLOR: Good afternoon.
- 5 MS. PANNELL: I was wondering if the police
- 6 are going to have some signs for the empty houses for
- 7 Angels Night.
- 8 COMMANDER WILSON: Yes, ma'am. We actually
- 9 did our kickoff press conference today at the Lafayette
- 10 Fire Station. They're starting to get those signs now.
- 11 So we should be having those out. Probably this
- 12 weekend actually start doing that. We're already doing
- our abandoned vehicle blitz. So we'll be doing that
- 14 this weekend.
- MS. PANNELL: At the precincts?
- 16 COMMANDER WILSON: Yes, some at the precincts
- 17 and then some at the neighborhood centers. So you
- 18 should be able to pick those up.
- MS. PANNELL: We don't have a neighborhood
- 20 center.
- 21 COMMANDER WILSON: You guys don't have a --
- 22 the rec center I should say. The mini stations inside
- 23 of the rec center.
- MS. PANNELL: We don't have a rec center at
- 25 Butzel.



- 1 COMMANDER WILSON: Well, we'll make sure,
- 2 Ms. Pannell, we get you some if I have to hand deliver
- 3 them to you.
- 4 MS. PANNELL: See about your mini station
- 5 over there at Butzel. The doors are broken. They got
- 6 a lot of robberies over there in the evening.
- 7 COMMANDER WILSON: Supposed to be a mini
- 8 station over there.
- 9 MS. PANNELL: It hasn't started.
- 10 COMMANDER WILSON: Well, we definitely will
- 11 look into that.
- 12 MS. PANNELL: They're going in. The air
- 13 conditioner is not working. The doors are broke.
- 14 Butzel is hit.
- 15 COMMANDER WILSON: Thank you.
- 16 CHAIRPERSON TAYLOR: Thank you, Ms. Pannell.
- 17 Anymore communications? Anymore communications?
- 18 Anymore communication?
- 19 George, you need to acknowledge him.
- 20 SECRETARY ANTHONY: We have Lieutenant Tim
- 21 Leach, who just came into the meeting, a member of
- 22 the staff, OCI.
