RE: Reparations Task Force Survey

Council President Sheffield created a survey to gather community input relative to the proposed composition of the voter approved Reparations Task Force. After receiving over four hundred responses to the survey questions from members of the community, the Legislative Policy Division, (LPD) has been requested to provide a report summarizing the results and offering a recommendation based upon the responses received.

In order to gather additional input from the community, Council President Sheffield created a survey to inquire as to how the Reparations Task Force should be comprised relating to size, eligibility criteria, and composition. The survey received 412 responses from the community and the results were as follows:
