

City of Detroit Residents Save Over a Quarter of a Million Dollars on Prescription Discount Card Program

On March 15, 2010 City Clerk Janice Winfrey and Council President Pugh unveiled the City of Detroit Prescription Discount Card Program for ALL Detroit residents that will help reduce the cost for prescription drugs.

The purpose of this press conference is to update you on how well the City of Detroit has done since the program was launched almost a year ago.

The **Prescription Discount Card** is made available to residents by the City of Detroit in collaboration with the National League of Cities (NLC), Washington, DC.

The Prescription Discount Card offers savings on prescription drugs to residents who are without health insurance, a traditional benefit plan, or have prescriptions that are not covered by insurance.

The card is **Free to all Detroit residents**, regardless of age, income or existing health insurance. By using this card you **may save an average of 20%** off the regular retail price of prescription drugs at participating pharmacies.
