EXPUNGEMENT

How to Determine if You Qualify Next Steps

IF YOU HAVE ONE FELONY ON YOUR RECORD

- You may apply to have it set aside
- You must not have more than 2 misdemeanors on your record
- You must wait 5 years from the date of the final disposition completion of your sentence (i.e. probation parole, etc.) before applying

YOU **CANNOT** HAVE THESE TYPES OF FELONIES SET ASIDE:

- Felonies with possible life sentences (i.e. armed robbery, murder, kidnapping, etc.)
- Criminal sexual conduct except 4th degree (if committed before Jan. 12, 2015)
- Child abuse
- Child pornography
- Using a computer to solicit a minor or for stalking
- Operating while intoxicated (felony)
- Felony domestic violence, if you also have a misdemeanor domestic violence
- Human trafficking
- > Terrorism

IF YOU HAVE ONLY 2 MISDEMEANORS AND NO FELONIES ON YOUR RECORD

- You may apply to have them both set aside
- You must wait 5 years from the completion of your sentence (i.e. probation parole, etc.) before applying

ELIGIBILITY

- Only convictions from MICHIGAN cases can be expunged
- However, out-of-state and federal convictions count as priors for determining eligibility

JUVENILE ADJUDICATIONS

- If you have juvenile adjudications you wish to have set aside, see an attorney
- Slightly different expungement process

FREE LEGAL REPRESENTATION

- Free legal representation at hearings
- Detroit Residences ONLY
- In the court that sentenced you
- You must follow-up with the city's employment agency for job trainings or job placement assistance
- You will still be responsible for all of the application costs and fees
 - \$50 application fee
 - \$15 fingerprint fee
 - Postage
 - Any cost obtaining certified copies of records

STEPS FOR EXPUNGEMENT PROCESS:

- Determine if you are eligible
- Obtain from the court of conviction a certified copy of the conviction that you want set aside
- 3. Get fingerprinted on a RI-8 Card at 3rd Precinct \$15 fingerprint fee
- Submit completed application, fingerprint card, certified copy of conviction and \$50 money order payable to Michigan State Police.
- 5. Submit copy of completed application to Michigan Attorney General
- Submit copy of completed application to Prosecutor's office.
- Attend expungement hearing in the court (court & judge where you were convicted)
- Obtain an Order from the court setting aside conviction
- Once set aside, the conviction will not appear on your public record

Steps for Project Clean Slate process:

- Register at Project Clean Slate Conference, or Pre-register online at http://www.detroitmi.gov/projectcleanslate
- 2. Question and Answer with Expert Panel of Judges and Attorneys
- 3. Consultation with attorney regarding your case history. If you qualify under the State Expungement statute, the attorney will sign off on your transition form for Detroit Employment Solutions Corp. (DESC)
- 4. Register with DESC to schedule your follow-up meeting with a õjob readinessö service counselor.
- 5. After follow-up meeting with DESC you will be contacted by Lakeshore Legal Aid or an attorney to handle your application and court date!
