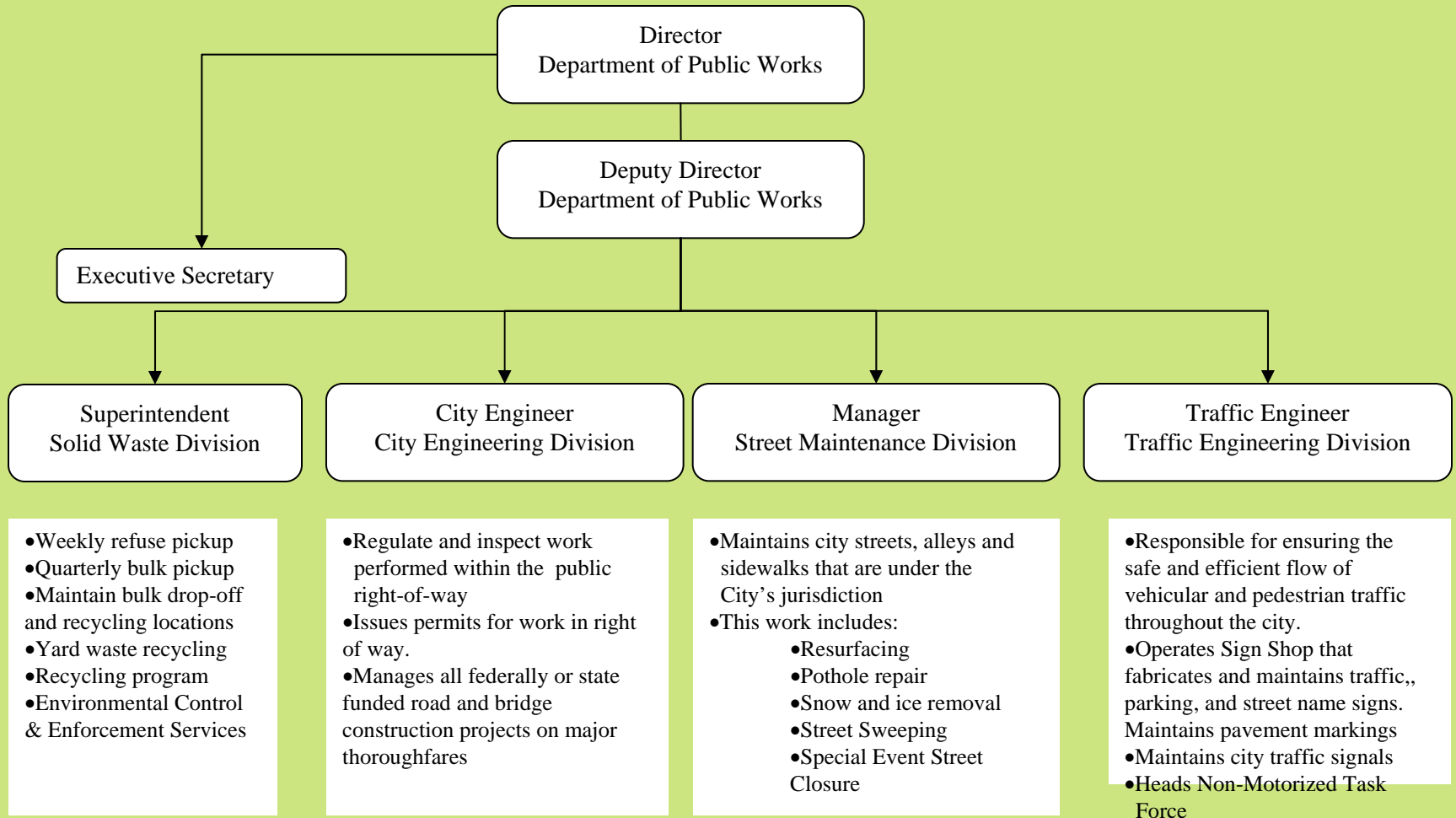

- ***P**erform their responsibilities knowing they care and they know that their work directly impacts your quality of life.

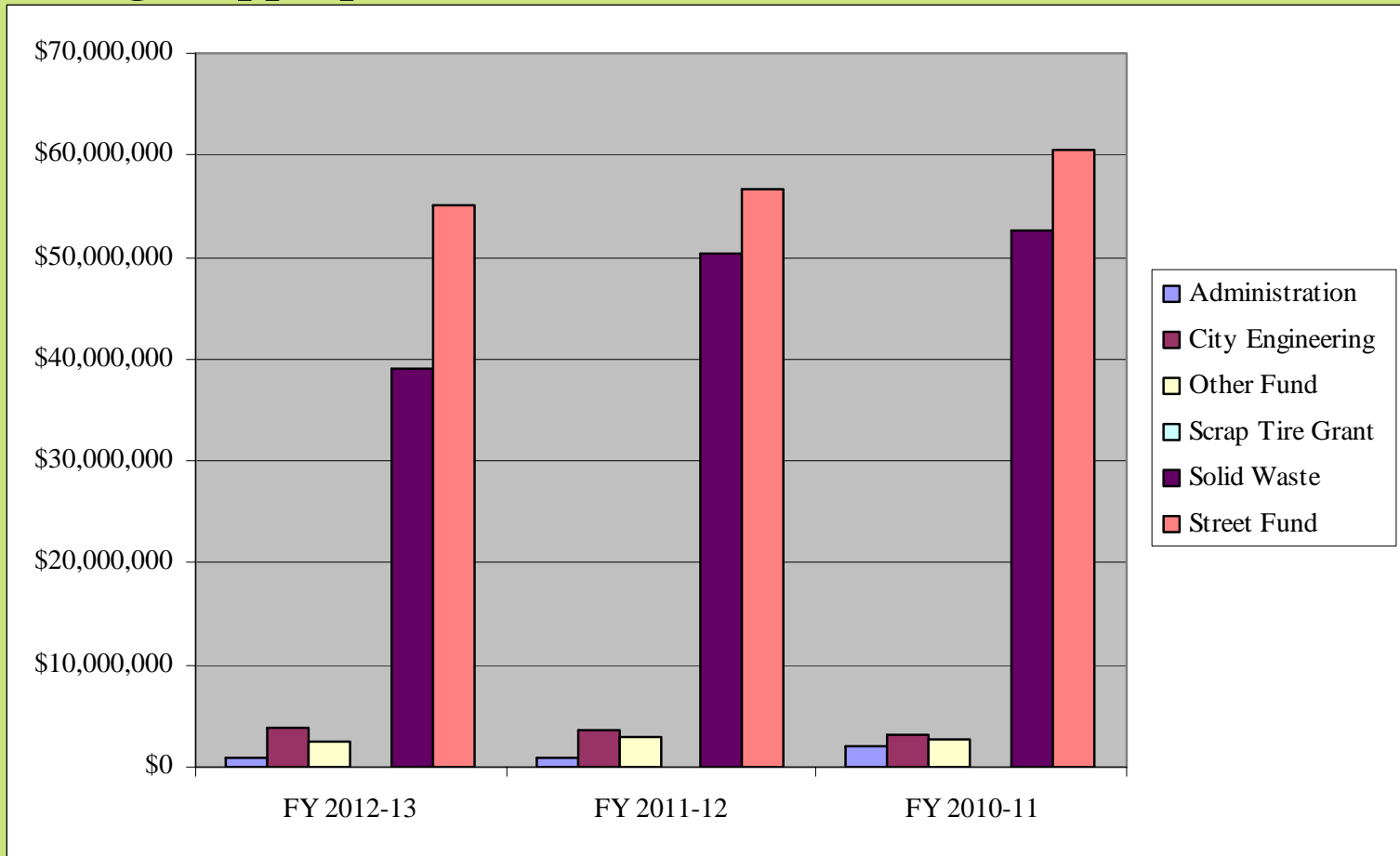


The Department of Public Works shall:

1. Provide for the management and collection of all solid waste.
2. Cooperate with other City departments and regional agencies to enforce both City of Detroit Municipal Codes, Chapter 9 (Property Maintenance) and Chapter 22 (Solid Waste), and other environmental statutes except as otherwise provided by law or charter.
3. Provide for the construction, maintenance and engineering design of streets and alleys.
4. Plan, establish and maintain systems and devices for safe and expeditious regulation and control of traffic within the city.
5. Perform other functions necessary to improve the quality of the environment as provided by law or ordinance.

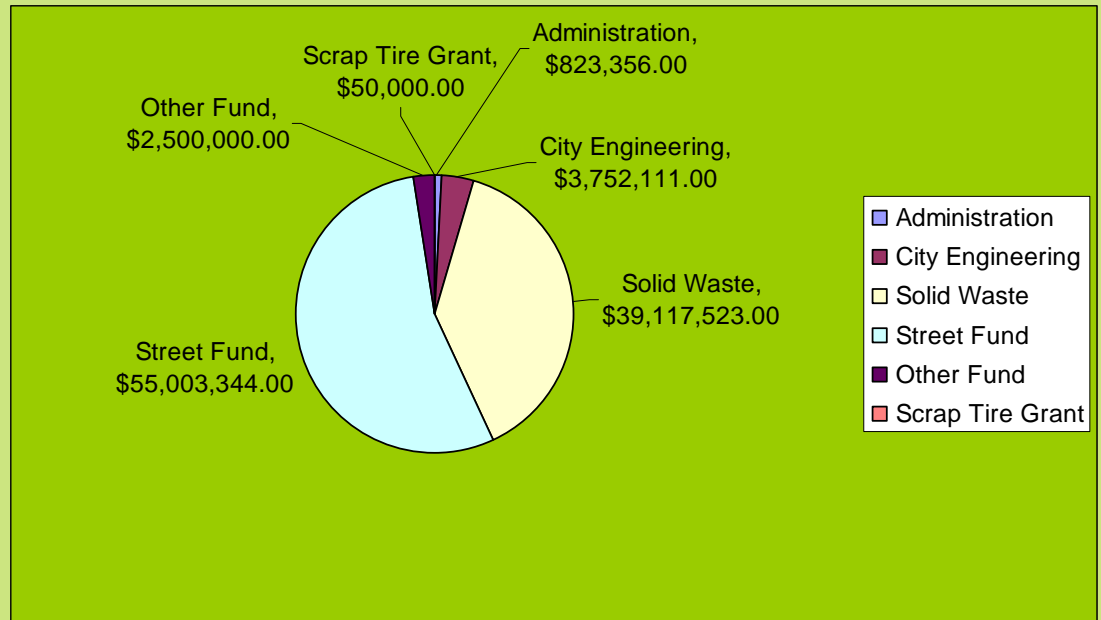

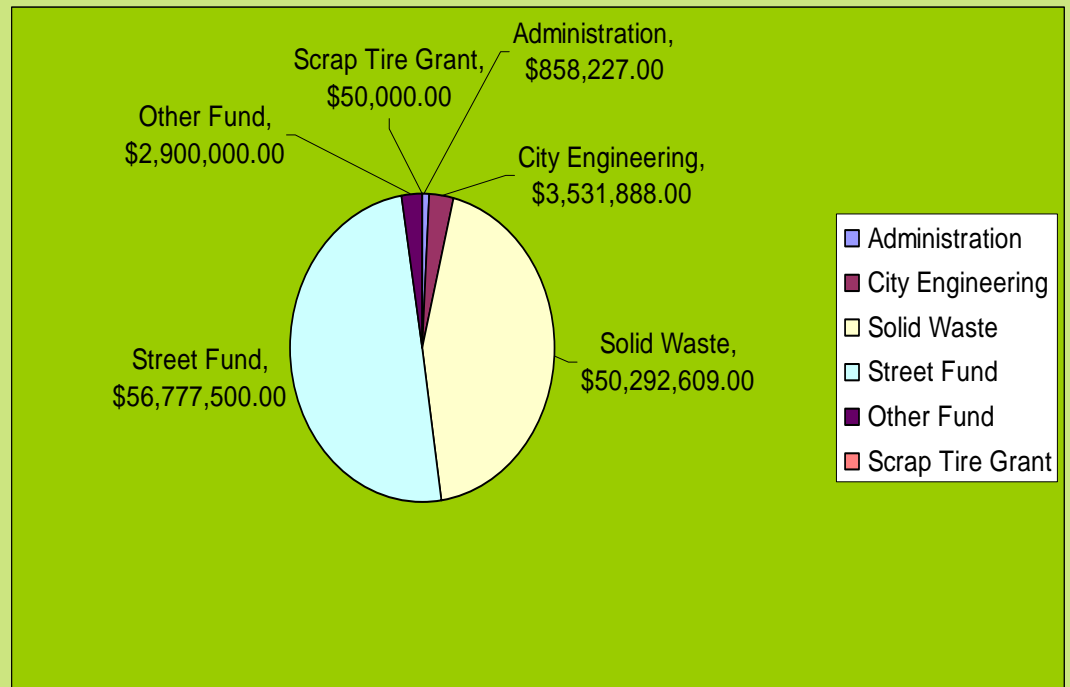

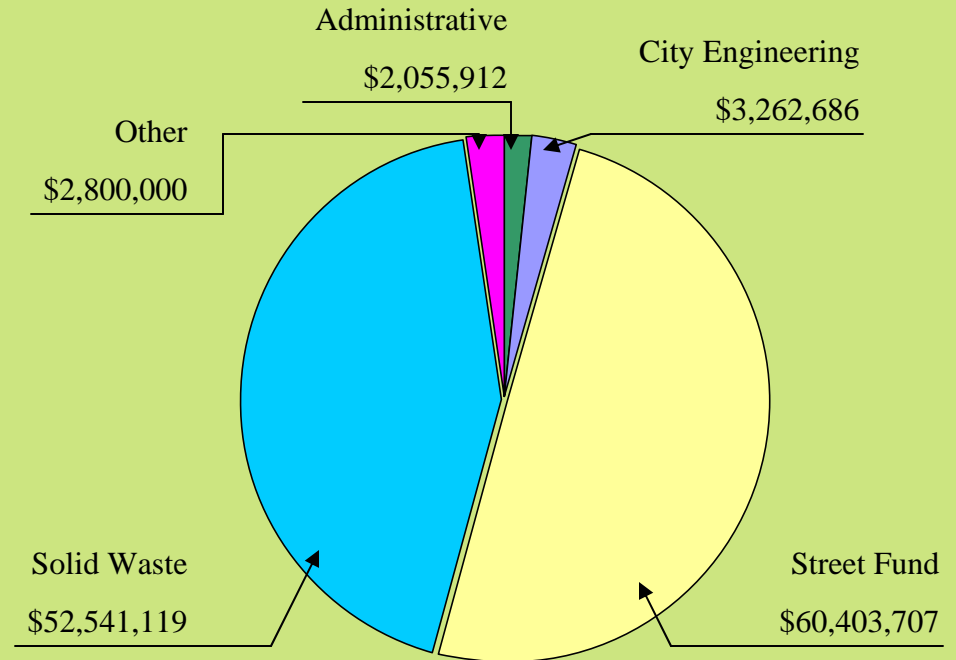
