The City of Detroit's STEP Initiative is an important advance to the creation of access to training and careers in skilled trades for Detroit residents. The program is an important component of creating "a seamless on-ramp training and employment system" that links school-based exposure and preparation to internship, job shadowing, part-time and summer employment, and pre-apprentice programs to Registered Apprenticeships. The Black Caucus Foundation considers it a foundational pillar of our Bridges to Work advocacy and hope that organizations and individuals join with us in supporting this effort as well as collaboration on other key program efforts to provide Detroiters with optimum opportunity for access to these "good paying" career options. The programs below are available in school-settings, employer sites, union halls, community centers churches, and will also be offered from new offices in Northwest Detroit (17227 W 7Mile) in 2017.



Preparation of Tomorrow's Workforce


School-based LifeSkills are facilitated weekly by Black Caucus Foundation staff as part of middle and high school academic schedules to provide Detroit Public School students with positive image, character tools, decision-making, as well as drug resistance and avoidance skills to support their navigation to college and craft career success. This evidence based instruction which includes preand post-tests for each instruction module empowers Detroit students to excel via provision of stackable tools and skills essential for success. Adults will be offered access to this programing via the new Northwest office; and Employers, Trade Unions, Church and Community organizations may contact us for "Train the Trainer" classes with specialized approaches to instructing Veterans, Dislocated Youth, the Long-term Unemployed and Returning Citizens. Job Readiness Through Knowledge and Skill Augmentation

Pursuing a "skills upgrade" frequently requires an improvement in reading, writing, comprehension, math and communication. Whether you are an adult or young adult that needs to "refresh" skills or basic instructional support that will afford you an opportunity to competitively apply for craft training or a skilled job opportunity; the Black Caucus Foundation Institute for Leadership Development & Career Advancement can assess your current skill level and design a customized instructional program for you that will help you both improve your skills and give you confidence in your ability to compete either as an employee, or as mentee in our Bridges to Entrepreneurship Program. Our on-line program tool can be accessed from your home and is designed to provide foundational skills and exercises that use those skills to advance knowledge and capability. Our program contains an algorithm that reverts to a previous foundational lesson without telling you if an advancing exercise is performed incorrectly. We know that building confidence in your ability is equally important to your success. Thus, you are never told you have failed at an exercise, rather you are required to perform the exercise correctly several times under different scenarios before being allowed to advance forward as a method of reinforcing that you are a winner! Other services include resume and job search support, understanding job applications, interview skill building, managing behavior, relationships and communication on the job, mental health assessment and support, drug testing and treatment referral; and personal appearance, hygiene, grooming and oral presentation tools. Mastery of these skills is fundamental to work readiness. Every participant receives a "personal pass code protected" on-line lesson plan that will allow them access their study modules from anywhere, 24 hours a day.

Exposure, On-the Job Training and Career Preparation

Each year more than 1,000 Detroit students that have successfully completed the Black Caucus Foundation's LifeSkills Program and have pledged to be drug free are afforded an opportunity to attend the **Annual Construction Science Expo** facilitated by members of the Michigan Design & Construction Coalition in May. The Expo is comprised of the Michigan Department of Transportation, trade unions, contractors and employers in the design and construction trades that support increasing local and diverse hires in the industry. Attendees get "hands-on" exposure to a broad range of career options and those that successfully complete on-site exercises are afforded summer employment or year-around part-time employment opportunities until high school graduation. A sub-group of the coalition has organized itself into the <u>Detroit Job Shadow Coalition</u> and will be offering 11th and 12th grade students at Randolph, Cody and Osborn job-shadowing, summer employment and intern opportunities on a competitive basis in partnership with Detroit Employment Solutions, Cadillac Asphalt, Laborers, and Operating Engineers.
