

# **COVID-19 SITUATION REPORT**

01/17/2024

Data current as of 01/17/2024

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### **Summary**

- Compared to the previous report (12/21/2023), the 7-day average rate of new confirmed COVID-19 cases increased from 67.5 daily cases per million people to 120.2 daily cases per million people (Figure 1).
  - The 7-day average case rate in Detroit City is higher than the rate for the Detroit Region (96.8 daily cases per million) and that for Michigan (86.8 daily cases per million).
  - The current CDC COVID-19 Hospital Admissions Level for Detroit, Wayne County is Medium at 14.5 new COVID-19 hospital admissions per 100,000 population, 7-day total (Figure 2).
- DHD recorded 794 new cases and 0 COVID-19-related deaths over the past 14 days, compared to 769 cases and 1 deaths in the previous report (Table 1).
- Hospital capacity (Figure 8):
  - The proportion of COVID-19-positive inpatients increased from 2.0% to 2.9% since the previous report.
  - The proportion of ICU beds occupied decreased from 79.1% (363/459) to 77.9% (359/461) since the
    previous report, however, this figure does not account for staffing shortages/other factors that
    impact hospital capacity.
- Vaccine distribution in Detroit MDHHS COVID-19 Vaccine Dashboard
  - 817,230 total COVID-19 vaccine doses have been administered in the City of Detroit as of 01/02/24.
  - 49.1% of Detroit residents have received at least the first dose of their vaccination series as of 01/02/24; 4.8% of Detroit residents are up-to-date with their vaccination series per CDC recommendations for the 2023-2024 season.
- Wastewater monitoring (Figure 9):
  - Wastewater monitoring shows 86% of sampling sites have detectable levels and 45% of sites have high levels of SARS-CoV-2 markers as of 01/08/2024 in the city of Detroit.
- Variant of Concern (VOC) and Variant of Interest (VOI) estimations from CDC Variant Monitoring:
  - The Omicron variant is estimated to comprise 100% [58.4% are JN.1, 14.7% are HV.1, 4.4% are JD.1.1, 4.0% are HK.3, 3.7% are JG.3, 3.2% are BA.2.86, 2.5% are EG.5, 1.4% are GE.1, 0.9% are JF.1, 0.8% are FL.1.5.1, 0.8% are BA.2, 0.8% are EG.5.1.8, 0.8% are XBB.1.16.17, 0.6% are XBB.1.16.6, 0.4% are HF.1, 0.4% are XBB.1.16.11, 0.4% are GK.1.1, 0.4% are XBB.1.5.70, 0.3% are XBB.1.16.15, 0.2% are XBB, 0.2% are XBB.1.9.1, 0.2% are XBB.2.3, 0.1% are GK.2, 0.1% are CH.1.1, and 0.1% are XBB.1.16] of new COVID-19 cases in our Health and Human Service region (HHS) (week ending 01/06/2024). All others are listed at 0.0%.

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




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Figure 3. Partial vaccination (at least one dose) coverage for Detroit residents as of 01/02/2024.




# Figure 5. Number of confirmed cases by week and age group since March 2020 and for the past 14 days (bottom)

Past 14 Day cases by Onset/Specimen Collection/Referral Date, with cumulative total lines.




Only confirmed cases are shown. The bars displayed are colored according to the number of cases with an age in years under 60 (dark blue) or 60+ (light blue). The "Age in Years" variable is created during analysis by using the "Age," and "Age Units" variables from MDSS. Cases are assigned to dates in the curve based on the "Combined Disease Date" of the case, which takes MDSS "Onset Date" as first preference, specimen collection date of the first positive test as second preference (calculated in analysis), and MDSS referral date as third preference. The lines show a running cumulative total of cases for under 60 years of age (yellow) and 60+ years of age (red). All numbers are preliminary and subject to change. Due to reporting delays, the past 4 days of referral dates are not shown.

\* Combined Disease Date is created during analysis using MDSS Onset Date as first preference, specimen collection date of the first positive test as second preference (calculated in analysis), and MDSS referral date as third preference.

MDSS Date of Death used, and counts based on the number of confirmed cases with deceased status on that day. Deceased status determined using Deceased variable created during analysis, which checks patient status and case disposition to see if the patient is deceased. Any mark of death in any of the three places is considered a deceased patient. "Patient Died" radio button is NOT used due to unreliable reporting from multiple sources. The past 14 days is filtered using Date of Death.

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Figure 7. Age and sex distribution of confirmed cases since March 2020 (top) and for the past 14 days (bottom).




Cases are broken into categories using the Age range variable (calculated in analysis using Age and Age Units) and filtered for confirmed cases only. The percentage shown is the percentage out of all total cases, and the number shown is the total number of cases in that category. The past 14 days are filtered based on a Combined Disease Date\* within the past 14 days. Due to reporting delays, the past 4 days of referral dates are not shown. This is filtered using MDSS Referral\_Date.



Figure 9. Proportion of Detroit wastewater sampling sites with detectable or high levels of SARS-CoV-2 markers in the past 4 weeks.



The proportions are out of 22 sites across the city of Detroit from which wastewater samples are taken and tested for SARS-CoV-2 markers. Each sampling site represents a specific population based on the area its sewer shed covers, such as long-term care facilities, college dormitories, and entire ZIP code areas. Detectable levels are over 1000 copies/100mL; high levels are over 5000 copies/100mL.
