Homelessness Taskforce meeting



For the first time the City, State, County, and Federal Government along with leading agencies and community groups gathered to address the issue of homelessness. The meeting convened by Councilwoman Sheffield set a precedent for the City of Detroit's future involvement in addressing homelessness. Over 75 subject matter experts converged on City Hall for this historic event. The night was marked by a moving presentation given by Pathways to Housing, a New York based organization nationally renowned for its work on homelessness using the "Housing First Model." The next taskforce meeting is set for Wednesday, March 25th at 3:30pm.

The budget hearing is scheduled to take place on Friday, March 6, 2015 at 4:30 P.M. in the City Council chambers. The Councilwoman encourages all District 5 residents to come down have their concerns heard.

D5 Spirit of Detroit



Community Development Block Grant Workshops



The time has come for non-profit organizations to apply for the Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) and Neighborhood Opportunity Fund (NOF) funding for the 2015-2016 Fiscal Year. All community organizations including neighborhood residents, business organizations, block clubs, human service organization, etc... who wish to participate in the development and implementation of either CDBG or NOF projects as advisers and/or operating agencies may submit proposals. The City Planning Commission will conduct 4 CDBG/NOF "Proposal Writing Workshops" on March 11th, 14th, 16th, and 19th. According to proposal criteria, a community group representative **must** attend a workshop to be eligible for funding.

0% Home Repair Loan Program



The Administration has created a pool of funds utilizing CDBG dollars and matching funds for foundations and banks to help residents with minor home repairs. The programs boasts up to \$25,000 - 0% interest loans, for residents who apply and qualify, to make minor home repairs. There are some requirements such as minimum credit scores, property taxes must be current, the home must be insured and there are loan-to-value restrictions. Councilwoman Sheffield, in principle, is very supportive of the program and concept but she remains vigilant in her efforts to restore the Home Repair Grant funding for Detroiters who can't meet the requirements or afford to repay a loan even at 0%. Applications will be available after 12 P.M. on March 24, 2015.


