8	paid the big bucks.
9	CHIEF INV. DAVIS-DRAKE: Okay, keep
10	that in mind. If I miss anything, please fill
11	in.
12	I believe the conversation was about
13	the use of Tasers and the fact that the officers,
14	specifically the sergeants and lieutenants that
15	were being promoted, wanted that.
16	They thought that that would be a great
17	de-escalation tool and that that of course is
18	it is much better than the use of a firearm.
19	So they were very much in support. We
20	were also in support of that. I know
21	Commissioner Bell did say that he would bring
22	that issue up with the department and lend his
23	support at that time, so and of course you
24	certainly have my support in that area.
25	We do realize there are a lot of issues



1	surrounding that, a lot of controversy.
2	Certainly there would be a lot of policy that
3	would have to have been written in order for that
4	to happen, but we would be remiss if we did not
5	bring that to your attention and let the
6	department know that this is something that they
7	want and that we are also in favor of.
8	ASST. CHIEF DOLUNT: I will relay that
9	to the Chief, thank you.
10	COMMISSIONER BELL: Okay, thank you,
11	Chief Investigator Drake. And may I add, this
12	issue came up in the discussion in the roll of
13	the Board of Police Commissioners, so I think
14	it's something that we need to look at early on
15	in terms of the pros and cons, all the issues
16	dealing with that, and they sort of remind us in
17	terms of explaining our duties and
18	responsibilities.
19	Well, you're the Board, you can really
20	weigh in on this issue because and the class
21	was clear. There was 110 percent support of this
22	particular issue, so I just wanted to share that
23	with you.
24	At some point in time maybe we can have



one of the committees, however we want to shape

Commissioner Moore? 3 4 COMMISSIONER MOORE: Just very briefly, 5 Mr. Chairman, just a point of clarification. 6 Taser is an intermediate weapon, it's not a replacement for a firearm or primary handgun. 7 8 CHIEF INV. DAVIS-DRAKE: That is 9 certainly the department's choice, but no, that's 10 not my understanding. COMMISSIONER MOORE: That's not the 11 12 department's choice, that's the way it's 13 structured. A Taser is not a replacement -- I 14 mean, as far at usage is concerned, but as far as a quideline --15 16 CHIEF INV. DAVIS-DRAKE: De-escalation 17 tool. 18 COMMISSIONER MOORE: Yeah, exactly, but it's not a replacement for the firearm. 19 20 CHIEF INV. DAVIS-DRAKE: It is not, no. 21 COMMISSIONER BURTON: Through the 2.2 Chair, one of the things I've been advocating for the past two and a half years was for this 23



department to have Tasers. I've been speaking

out on that for quite some time, not only before

24

1	this body, this Board, but also with the media.
2	But I just want to go forward just
3	looking at these minutes. You know, lately we
4	have not been in compliance with the Open
5	Meetings Act and as I'm looking at the minutes
6	here, you know, I like it to the point where we
7	approved the minutes today before I got here
8	actually because I ran a little bit behind
9	schedule, but looking at these minutes, I mean I
10	don't see how the Board can approve the minutes
11	if we just received these minutes today from
12	previous weeks.
13	We have not had minutes before this
14	body for six to eight weeks which approximately
15	is nearly a couple of months.
16	In addition, I'd like to put a motion
17	on the floor today for minutes to be for
18	minutes to be available for commissioners in that
19	48 hours prior to a meeting at least.
20	COMMISSIONER CRAWFORD: Through the
21	Chair. Commissioner Burton, I have a copy of the
22	Open Meetings Act, I've read it a few times. If
23	you care to peruse it anytime, you can borrow my
24	copy or I'll make you a copy.



25

I think we are within the Open Meetings

1	Act. By the way, prior to your arrival as you
2	stated the minutes from the previous meetings
3	were approved.
4	COMMISSIONER BURTON: Commissioner
5	Crawford
6	COMMISSIONER CRAWFORD: The Board
7	approved them.
8	COMMISSIONER BURTON: So they was
9	approved without having minutes prior? Today we
10	get minutes here, we don't even know if
11	everything is thoroughly within these minutes.
12	I'm looking at minutes from 7-25, 7-7,
13	7-14. You know, how do we know what's in these
14	minutes here is accurate today?
15	Have we all gone through this? I'm
16	just now receiving it and it was not in our
17	Tuesday package.
18	COMMISSIONER BELL: Could we have a
19	little order, please. At this time Commissioner
20	Burton we would entertain your concern, but this
21	is not the proper time to address the issue.
22	COMMISSIONER BURTON: But through the
23	Chair, the public must be aware, you know,
24	informed about all activities that take place
25	here with the Board.



1	COMMISSIONER MALLETT: Mr. Chairman, I
2	wonder if we might ask the Secretary what his
3	thoughts are surrounding this. I would think
4	that some degree of getting the minutes out
5	earlier so that they could be perused would be
6	something that the Secretary would be anxious to
7	do.
8	I just wonder if perhaps we would
9	COMMISSIONER BELL: Mr. Hicks?
10	COMMISSIONER BURTON: And a motion is
11	on the floor.
12	COMMISSIONER BELL: The motion, there's
13	no seconds, so there's no motion on the floor.
14	Mr. Hicks?
15	SECRETARY HICKS: Thank you, Mr. Chair.
16	What we typically do in connection with the
17	minutes is that pursuant to a meeting we prepare
18	essentially a quick draft of the minutes and we
19	keep those at draft in abeyance until we receive
20	we actually receive and this has been
21	working out quite well receive the official
22	transcript from the court reporter.
23	The official transcript of the court
24	reporter contains everything in your meeting, so
25	any indication under the Open Meetings Act that



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we are to report on who is present, what were the
actions and so on and so forth, all of those
things are, of course, inside of the official
transcript.

We then take that -- the transcript and what -- the transcript is often times anywhere from 100 to 150 pages long. You get the first few pages of the transcript. What that typically does is summarize of course who was present at the meeting, it typically summarizes any actions which you've taken and that's what you physically see.

We then post the entire transcript at the website, at the City of Detroit's website, and if you go to the website now you'll see at least a few years of postings, I think it's even up to maybe five years of postings of your official transcripts, and those transcripts are the official minutes.

There's nothing in the Open Meetings

Act that says that you cannot use the transcript,

especially since you go through the process of

having the court reporter present and paying in

connection with that.

The only times that I anticipate that



1	there would be a problem in this regard, and as I
2	understand it we haven't had this as a recent
3	problem at least, and that is when the payment
4	for the court reporter is extended because of
5	whatever city process is relative to contracts
6	and purchasing and so forth that we might then
7	have a problem in terms of getting the transcript
8	in here on a timely basis.
9	But that has not this is not
10	currently the state. We are getting the
11	transcripts in in a fairly short period of time,
12	able to then switch them out and have those
13	summary portions come to you all as a Board and
14	post the full transcript and all of that takes
15	place really with inside of a couple of weeks.
16	COMMISSIONER BURTON: Through the
17	Chair?
18	COMMISSIONER BELL: Could you pause, I
19	think Commissioner Mallett wanted to follow up.
20	COMMISSIONER MALLETT: Thank you.
21	Through the Chair, Mr. Secretary, so the
22	transcript would get posted within would it be
23	24 hours before we meet? I think that
24	Commissioner Burton
25	COMMISSIONER BURTON: 48 hours.



1	COMMISSIONER MALLETT: I understand.
2	Commissioner Burton is concerned that there be
3	some period prior to the meeting where we are now
4	that we all collectively have a chance to
5	review it. I'm just wondering operationally what
6	you believe your office could actually achieve.
7	SECRETARY HICKS: Thank you. Through
8	the Chair, in the last few weeks at least, and as
9	you know I've not been here that long, I have
10	noted that the transcripts are coming in on time
11	and that we are posting the transcripts
12	immediately upon receiving the transcripts, so
13	the transcripts may end up being posted prior,
14	two, three, maybe even four days prior to a
15	meeting, and if it's not, the lag time after the
16	meeting in terms of the official transcript
17	posting has been about a week.
18	COMMISSIONER MALLETT: Would you be
19	adverse to 24 hours prior to the regularly
20	scheduled Board of Commissioners meeting in terms
21	of having an official set of minutes posted on
22	the website?
23	I don't want to compromise the
24	operation and thrust upon you a set of
25	responsibilities that you can't meet, so I just



1	wonder what you would recommend to us as a
2	response.
3	SECRETARY HICKS: Thank you and again,
4	through the Chair, my recommendation to you is
5	that we post the transcript immediately upon
6	receipt of the transcript from the court
7	reporting service. That, as I will say this,
8	will vary and it will vary depending upon how
9	complicated the transcript the preparation of
10	the transcript may be as well as the payment from
11	the City.
12	Right now, it is working out, but what
13	I would say if we were to adopt a policy or a set
14	of practices in this area is to indicate to us
15	and we would do this and that is to post upon
16	receipt from the court reporting service.
17	COMMISSIONER BELL: Thank you.
18	Commissioner Crawford or
19	COMMISSIONER BURTON: It was Burton.
20	Through the Chair, I'd like for the Board's
21	attorney to weigh in on the Open Meetings Act as
22	well as the minutes retaining to the meeting.
23	Can you proceed, Attorney Bernard?
24	COMMISSIONER BELL: I'm going to ask
25	that we take a look at this item at another date



1	and time because we have convened this meeting to
2	have a short and to the point because we need to
3	be at the table to address and interact with our
4	young people which is a critical time and this
5	issue just came up, so if you would bear with me
6	in terms of the Chair of the Board, then we can
7	rush these issues
8	COMMISSIONER BURTON: Through the
9	Chair, I'd like it if the Board attorney can talk
10	basically briefly on what the Open Meetings Act
11	what it retains as well as reporting those
12	minutes out. I think we do owe that to the
13	citizens and residents of Detroit.
14	We are the bridge between the
15	department as well as the residents, so we do
16	have our due diligence and I think since the
17	conversation has been brought up I'd like it if
18	our attorney can speak to the Open Meetings Act
